



About Stage 2 LRT

Approved unanimously by Ottawa City Council in 2013, and further expanded to Trim Road and the Airport in 2016, Stage 2 LRT is a package of three extensions – east, west and south – totalling over 36 kilometres of new rail and 22 new LRT stations. Upon completion in 2023, Stage 2 will bring 70% of residents within five kilometres of rail. That means shorter commutes, cleaner air, and a stronger economy.

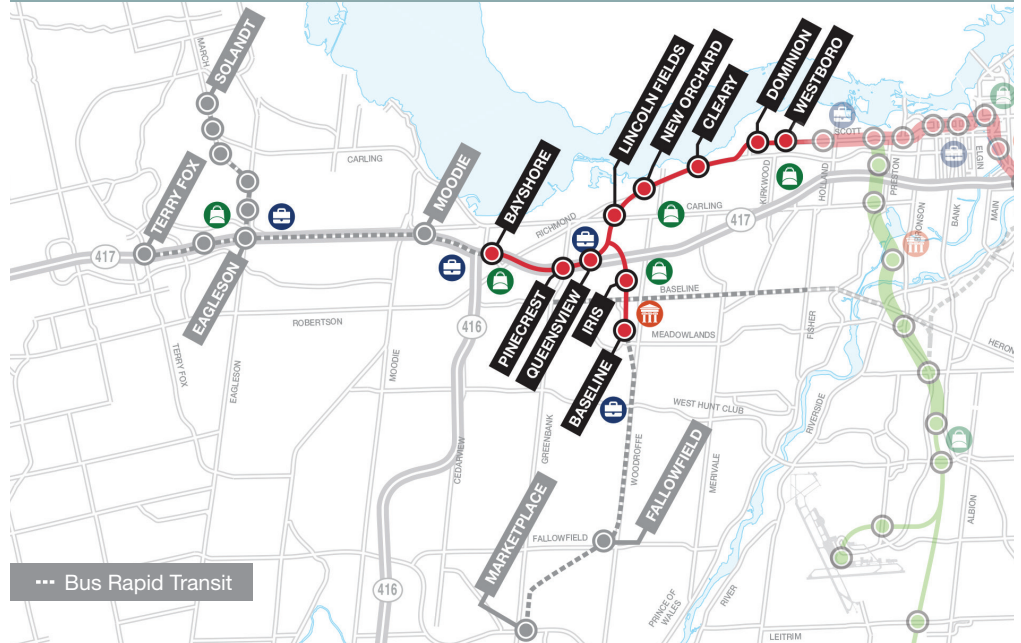
13 new kilometres of rail

The Stage 2 extension will add 13 kilometres of rail and 10 LRT stations – at Westboro, Dominion, Cleary, New Orchard, Lincoln Fields, Iris, Baseline, Queensview, Pinecrest and Bayshore – to the City's overall transit network.

Confederation Line WEST



Confederation Line West is one of the three Stage 2 extensions to Ottawa's O-Train system planned between 2018 and 2023. This extension will see LRT continue from Tunney's Pasture to Bayshore and Baseline Stations.

THIS EXTENSION WILL:

- Provide comfortable, reliable, efficient LRT connections to:
 - » **Retail** destinations including Westboro, Hintonburg/West Wellington, Pinecrest, and Lincoln Fields, College Square, and Bayshore shopping centres.
 - » **Greenspace** including the Ottawa River pathways and the National Capital Commission's future Linear Waterfront Park, Westboro Beach, Pinecrest Creek Corridor, etc.
 - » **Employment** centres including Tunney's Pasture, Queensview Drive/Pinecrest, Morrison Drive, Baxter Road, and Centrepointe.
 - » **Educational institutions**, community centres, and places of worship.
- Provide new and direct access to LRT for residents in the Hintonburg, Island Park, Westboro, Laurentian, Woodroffe/Lincoln Heights, Whitehaven-Queensway Terrace North, Bayshore, Iris, Centrepointe, and Lincoln Heights communities.
- Connect directly to the West Transitway to Kanata, and the Southwest Transitway to Barrhaven to facilitate the daily commute.
- Link to future Bus Rapid Transit investments further west to Kanata.
- Provide opportunities to maximize cycling connections at stations.
