Construction Notice - Borehole drilling

November 12, 2015

Dear Owner/Resident:

As part of the Ottawa Light Rail Transit Stage 2 project preliminary engineering work, some localized drilling will be starting in order to collect soil and water samples that will inform future design and construction of the Confederation Line alignment.

WHAT: Geotechnical and hydrogeological investigations will begin at various points along the future LRT extension alignments to collect soil and water samples. To collect these samples, 200mm-diameter vertical boreholes will be drilled along the alignment.

WHY: Geotechnical investigations are required to understand the environmental characteristics of the ground and groundwater. This information is provided to inform preliminary engineering and to ultimately provide potential bidders with sufficient information to price the cost of construction.

WHEN: November 16, 2015 through to the end of December 2015
Work will likely take place between 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday.

WHERE: A total of 25 boreholes will be drilled (including 16 monitoring wells) at the following locations:

- five along the Sir John A. Macdonald Parkway lands
- four along or adjacent to Richmond Road between Cleary Avenue and Lockhart Avenue
- eight along or adjacent to Hwy. 174 between Montreal Road and Blair Road
- three in the Transitway (Pinecrest Creek Corridor) south of Carling Avenue
- two in the OC Transpo Facility parking lot at 2611 Queensview Drive
- one in the parking lot at 747 Richmond Road
- one in the parking lot at 30 Cleary Avenue
- one in the Hwy. 417 westbound Pinecrest Road off-ramp

IMPACTS: During this field work, lane reductions may be required on:

- Richmond Road in the westbound lane between Cleary Avenue and Lockhart Avenue
- Highway 174 in the left westbound lane between Montreal Road and Blair Road

Boreholes will be located to minimize traffic impacts, and where possible, drilling will be scheduled outside of peak periods and avoid the closure of Multi Use Pathways.
